



## Just click to check health records

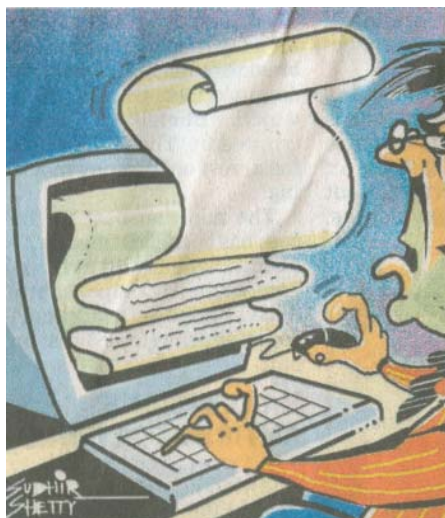
*Arogyadarpan offers anytime access and retrieval of vital medical information.*

Accessing one's medical history can now be without an ordeal. Pune-based Arogyadarpan Health Repository Private Limited has developed a repository through which medical information can be stored in an online platform.

“It started last year when I had taken an ailing person to a Pune hospital. They asked for his medical history. There was no way that we could access the entire history. At that moment, I decided to come up with an integrated solution wherein the entire medical history can be stored and accessed at any time,” said Arogyadarpan Chief Executive Officer (CEO) Sandeep Tapaswi.

Launched six months ago, Arogyadarpan is a pioneering, customer-centric online medical storage service. Over 2000 private users have already signed up for this online service.

Tapaswi said, “One has to get all his past medical history to us and after scanning, the details automatically get uploaded on a central server and all health data gets stored on the website. If at any time a person needs to check his medical history, all s/he has to do is log on to the site.”

The cost of the application is Rs.200 per annum per user. “The security system installed is like those used by any e-commerce applications and password secured. No one can tamper with the information loaded,” Tapaswi said.

The firm, which has so far delivered the solution to individual clients, has also formed an alliance with leading medical practitioners from the city in a bid to reach out to a wider populace.

“We are also in talks with several pathology laboratories and clinics in the city wherein reports of medical tests can be uploaded on the web without the patient actually having to visit the place. This would however require much advanced R & D in the form of intermediary bridge software which is currently under development,” he said.

The portal has interesting content related to health. The content is presently bilingual, in English and Marathi.
